I refer to the above details. An appeal has been made to the Secretary of State against an **Enforcement Notice** issued by Herefordshire Council. The appeal will be determined on the basis of **written representations** and a site visit by an Inspector.

Description of the alleged breach of planning control:

Without planning permission the unauthorised material change of use of the Land from agricultural to a mixed use for agriculture and to site a caravan marked with an "X" on the enforcement notice plan for residential purposes.

The enforcement notice was issued for the following reasons:

It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last ten years and is therefore not immune from enforcement action.

The siting of a caravan for a residential purpose is a material change of use of the land. This material change of use does not benefit from planning permission and is therefore unauthorised.

The continued siting of a caravan for a residential purpose in this specific rural location, and in the absence of any evidence demonstrating that there is an essential functional need for the caravan, represents an unjustified and unsustainable form of residential development. This is contrary to policy RA3 of the Herefordshire Local Plan – Core Strategy.

The Council do not consider that planning permission should be given, because planning conditions could not overcome these objections to the development.

The appellant has appealed against the notice on the following grounds:

- *Ground (b) that the breach of control alleged in the enforcement notice has not occurred as a matter of fact.
- *Ground (d) that, at the time the enforcement notice was issued, it was too late to take enforcement action against the matters stated in the notice.
- *Ground (e) the notice was not properly served on everyone with an interest in the land.
- *Ground (f) the steps required to comply with the requirements of the notice are
- excessive and lesser steps would overcome the objections.
- *Ground (g) that the time given to comply with the notice is too short.

Please note that any representations you submit to the Planning Inspectorate will be copied to the appellant and this local planning authority and will be considered by the Inspector when determining the appeal unless they are withdrawn by **31 July 2020**.
