Winter service has started! Our gritting teams have completed dry runs at our Thorn and Kingsland depots.

Deliveries of road salt have filled the barns and grit bins have been refilled. Our teams are monitoring temperatures on the county's roads ready for action to deploy our gritters when the weather gets colder.

What's been happening?

In October, we've started a number patching schemes following receipt of additional funding from the Department for Transport. Several C and U roads across the county have been completed so far including the one pictured below, in South Herefordshire.

Cabinet Member for Roads and Regulatory Services, Cllr Barry Durkin, recently visited one of our sites on the C1234, between Pontrilas and Bagwyllydiart, to see how the works were progressing.



We completed resurfacing works on the C1108 Village Street in Wellington during the half-term period.

Works are ongoing on Ledbury Road in Ross-on-Wye to install new traffic signals.

We have recently completed bridge arch strengthening works on Eye Lane in Luston.

Our storm response

Storm Babet brought heavy and persistent rain to the region, resulting in localised flash flooding and other hazards on the county's roads.

During the height of the storm on Friday 20th October, Herefordshire Council, in partnership with Balfour Beatty Living Places, handled over 140 enquiries through the Public

safety critical (Cat 1a) jobs on the Friday and raised a further 46 nonurgent jobs. Our teams continue to work hard to address defects and issues caused by the storm.

Our teams made preparations for the incoming Storm Ciaran on Thursday 2nd November, however thankfully no major issues occurred on the county's network.
