## Walford Parish (WPC)

## Highways:

- Footpaths: Thanks to Cllr Evans & Susan White (BBLP) for their written contribution to a complaint received via MP Jesse Normans' office about footpaths being closed/inaccessible/poorly maintained across fields with crops. My e-mail with the true facts was well received and shared with the complainant.
- Bridleways: local horse-riders have complained about overhanging vegetation + landowners laying inappropriate surfaces on local bridleways. These issues are being taken forward within WPC (re: overhanging vegetation - as stated on the British Horse Society website - permission needs to be sought from landowners before carrying out works)
- Blocked drain on Walford Road affecting local home BBLP has investigated with WPC Maintenance Co-ordinator. However, the view is that current drainage system not able to cope with storm flooding.
- Leys Hill Junction thanks to local resident Bill Cansdale for organising an excellent multiagency meeting on Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> August. Awaiting WPC direction.
- Trees blown down on Walford Rd thanks to BBLP for quick action in removing the trees
- Water leak on Deepdene Rd has returned and Welsh Water has been notified as has BBLP

## Outstanding:

- Awaiting WPC's view on clearing riparian ditches/drains Lengthsman Scheme (having an annual maintenance programme) – mitigating storm damage + avoiding flooding in local homes (eg. Parbrook)
- o HGV sign on Howle Hill at the top of Church Lane
- Formal Complaint re: accident on WA39 (awaiting 'what constitutes a safe bridleway surface' from a group of local horse riders and British Horse Society)
- Water leak + spring running down Deepdene
- Closure of WA50 (this is being picked up by BBLP in September)
- Kerne Bridge Launch site (recycling/ecological responsibilities in contract)
- WA25 Bridge (Cllr Evans)
