#### Council news

Last week the Council's cabinet took the decision to seek an early termination of the Highway contract with Balfour Beatty. The contract indicates a two-year notice has to be given; so, for the next two years the contract remains in place but the council will be working on a new operational model with a mixture of in house and out sourced delivery of services. Equally important is to skill up the council commissioning side to tighten the monitoring and delivery of the contract.

The additional council funding for joint working with Parish councils on drainage works next to our highways is beginning to be rolled out- this work will be undertaken by lengthsmen across the parishes. The latest roll out of summer resurfacing and dressing programme is awaited.

In Hereford City a government grant of £541K will be used to upgrade traffic signals. Improvements will replace in-road vehicle detection with more modern and reliable above ground options which will be more efficient. The improvements will allow interaction and coordination along the major City routes including the A49 which is controlled by the Highways Agency.

# The River Wye

An important announcement was made by the Government last month on the future of the river Wye. A nine-point plan was announced. This runs over ten years with investment of £35m aimed at improving the quality of the river.

The plan includes the appointment, approved by the Prime Minister, of Anthea McIntyre CBE as River Champion. Many of you will know Anthea who lives in the Parish.

# **Herefordshire Tourism**

The local annual tourism conference took place in Hereford recently where the work of the Herefordshire County Bid team, who promote tourism in our county, was highlighted. All tourism businesses with a rateable value over £12,000 pay a levy which is ring-fenced for the Herefordshire Bid team to use to fund tourism promotion and support.

Herefordshire Council works with the team managing the various government grants for Rural enterprise, Rural tourism, Cultural development and Community infrastructure. Recently the Bid team have been awarded Local Visitor Economic Partnership status which means prestigious collaboration with Visit England on initiatives in the sector.

The BID run many promotions – currently Blossom County, oversee promotion of County in Magazines and newspapers, social media and placement of articles. They commission data from the movement of our mobile phones, showing how many visitors there are to our City and market towns using the information to drive strategy and targeting. The BID also offers training, development and support for businesses and their staff.

Two recent interesting projects are the promotion of Herefordshire for its dark skies at night and the suitability of our County as locations for Film and TV companies. It is estimated the visitor economy is worth approximately £550 million to Herefordshire employing the equivalent of 6,500 full time employees.
